# FROM THE BIMA Cantor Kim Singer

Last month my mother turned 75. To celebrate, we took a family cruise to Alaska. Yes, we had a great time. We got to see mountains and marine life, and we survived the week in close quarters with minimal internet access. My mother had eagerly anticipated two things in particular (other than the extended family togetherness): the mega zip line, and seeing sea life. In particular, she wanted to see whales. Long about day five she commented that she was having a fabulous time, but was a little disappointed there had been no whales. "What do you mean?" I asked. "We spotted over a dozen on the second day out." At which point I realized, that she'd been expecting a more obvious showing—she wanted to see entire whales jumping out of the water and splashing back down. What we'd actually spotted were tips of dorsal fins, a few backs, maybe a bit of whale tail.

It struck me that synagogue life is a bit like that sometimes. We know without question that a community is thriving when we witness big events—High Holidays, B'nai Mitzvah, clergy installations. Those are the moments when we see the whole whale, as it were: inspiring, dramatic and memorable. But also uncommon. Day to day congregational life is more subtle. Shabbat attendance is another typical way to judge a synagogue's strength. Certainly, it's the most visible thing that we do on an ongoing basis. And it does seem to me that's on the upswing at TSS as well. I think being in a lovely new worship space helps to make services even more inspirational. There is the added benefit that having a larger community for prayer feels more energized, which makes even more people want to participate. But that, too, is only a partial indicator of our success. As with those pods of whales, there is a great deal going on just under the surface, and it's not always obvious unless you're paying close attention. So let me point out a few of the signs that you may have missed that continue to give me an increased sense of optimism about Temple Shir Shalom.

- \* Our new model of shared leadership has energized the board. Like a good basketball teams, tasks now get passed to someone who is "open," so action items get addressed more quickly, and hopefully with less burn-out.
- \* We're slowly but surely becoming more visible in the greater Or-

I hope you are as excited as I am about our new school adventure—MAGAL, the Meitin Alliance for Growth and Learning! You should have received information and registration forms by email. Combining two school populations makes our process for starting the year more complicated and it will help a great deal to have accurate enrollment numbers in advance.

Our school will meet in the lovely classrooms at Temple Israel. A slightly longer school day (ending at 12:30 instead of noon) will give us the opportunity for more enrichment activities like art and music. Our Hebrew curriculum will stay the same, but will add an online component to make the important (but not always engaging) aspect of practicing at home much more fun and easier for parents and teachers to track. Jewish studies will cover the same material, but through the lens of Jewish historical personalities, which makes concepts more concrete and memorable.


