## FROM THE BIMA Cantor Kim Singer

This week we start a new book of Torah and a new year. I've never been one for resolutions on any of the various new years that come around as we travel through the calendar, but this year it seems an appropriate time for taking stock and making plans for the coming months.

On a personal level, I'm hoping to get my half marathon time back under three hours. Not having to worry about ice does make the winter training a easier. (Of course, this year there really isn't any ice in Massachusetts either). I've also been accepted into the program that will allow me to become a member of the American Conference of Cantors, which is the professional organization for cantors within the Reform movement. (My ordination was through a different seminary, which means some extra hoops to jump through).

I also want to bring you up to date on some things happening on the professional side—some of which you've probably noticed, but some that will be emerging in the next few weeks and months.

December saw our inaugural Shabbat Jam service. Kudos and many thanks to the musicians who answered the call to "just come and bring instruments:" Cy Barnert, recorder, Sarah Cooper, trumpet, Ben Greenberg, tenor sax, Sam Greenberg baritone sax, Austin House, trombone, Judy Procell, percussion, Jennifer Sherman, flute, Thomas Ulman, percussion, Joel Zishuk, guitar. I know the December date was tricky for many of our musicians. I hope more of you will be able to join our next Jam on February 5! Please email CantorKim@gmail.com for music. It's fine to start with just one or two songs. Let's make a joyful noise!

I've also met with various leaders to raise TSS's visibility in the larger community. I'll be co-leading the women's Tu Bish'vat seder for JNF on January 21. I hope some of you will join me. We're also working on collaborations with UCF Hillel—more info when details are set.

Finally (for now), January 22nd is Shabbat Shira, the Sabbath of Song. So named because both Torah and Haftarah portion for the week feature a poem/song—the Song at the Sea and Song of Debo-

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Aaron Sherman

Each year my family travels north to visit extended family living in the Midwest. Driving north from Florida gives me an opportunity to see the seasons change quickly from "summer" (let's face it... when the A/C is still on, it's still summer) to winter. Over the course of a day, I get to see the results of changes that have happened slowly over the course of several weeks during the fall. Sometimes in our lives, something significant happens and we notice the changes as easily as you notice the seasons shifting while driving across the country. Other times, we watch the change happen slowly around us until it is so complete we notice that it is different.

For me, December has been a month in which I've noticed how the goals the Board set for Temple Shir Shalom in August are being carried out for the benefit of the congregation. We've been adding little pieces here and there through the fall. We are still working on every week Shabbat observances, but while we do so, Cantor Kim has introduced some new elements to our Friday services. We're now reading Torah once a month during our Friday services. We're also doing more with themed Shabbat services, whether it is a Religious School class led Shabbat service, or the first of Temple Shir Shalom's Shabbat Jam where anyone who plays a musical instrument is invited to participate. The idea that we need to provide a variety of activity for our membership has been a Board discussion point for several years and I'm glad to have Cantor Kim's help and leadership in bringing this variety to our Shabbat services.

During the fall, the Board also established an emphasis for engaging more with the community. We set this as a five year goal, but there have been some important first steps taken this fall that will set the foundation for accomplishing the goal. The Membership Team, under Jennifer Hall's leadership, has been very active this fall in finding ways to participate in our local and Jewish Communities. rah, respectively. Many synagogues offer a special musical program. That date also marks the fifth yahrzeit for Debbie Friedman, z"l, so we'll be featuring her music, some familiar and some less well-known.

The opening chapters of Shemot jump quickly: the sons of Jacob settle in Egypt, a Pharaoh enslaves them, Moses encounters God at the burning bush and returns to Egypt to free his kinfolk. The initial steps to freedom made the lives of the Israelites worse, not better. Pharaoh answers the demand for their release by cutting off the supply of straw but insisting on the same number of bricks (meaning they had to gather their own straw in addition to the other tasks.) The people, not surprisingly, are upset at Moses, leading him to ask God, "Why did you send me?" God tells Moses to be patient, that the (temporary) discomfort serves a greater good.

I'd like to thank you all for sticking by me as we adapt to each other. There have been glitches, and there will undoubtedly be more. But I believe that it's all for a greater good. Hazak, hazak v'nithazek-may we continue to be strong, and to strengthen one another.
