FROM THE BIMA Cantor Kim Singer

Judaism teaches that God is continually renewing creation. It's a radical idea: we perceive that things have permanence, but really, every day is a reboot. (Another version of the teaching says that the full reboot takes 7,000 years. I guess that puts Windows 10 into perspective.) But there is no denying the power of new-ness--whether it's a new relationship, a new restaurant or a new Religious School. There is an inherent excitement and sense of optimism in new experiences. For me, the idea that all of creation is new every day challenges us to discover ways to find the energy that comes so naturally with new endeavors in things and situations that are more familiar.

I've had two particularly strong examples of "new energy" during the first few weeks of MAGAL, our new collaborative Religious School. On the first day the last two hours were an educational and community building program with the entire school. As a group of about a dozen students enthusiastically charged by in search of the next stop on their scavenger hunt, Rabbi Neely—my partner in running the school—turned to me and said, "you know, I'd forgotten what this many kids in the building feels like." The next week we had all the students on the bimah practicing for our first Shabbat service together (Friday Sept 2!). We said, "that was nice, but can you sing a little louder?" The volume doubled. Their voices filled the Temple Israel sanctuary. It was beautiful and inspiring.

But as I said, those are the easy times. It's a challenge to keep tapping into that energy over time. Many of my friends posted photos of their child's first day of school. But not of the second, and probably not of the 150th. Don't get me wrong. New things are special and should be recognized. We even have a bracha for that shehecheyanu. But the idea that creation renews every day reminds us that life continues to be amazing even when it has become a bit more routine.

That's a big part of what the High Holydays are for. Reminding us to pay attention to the cycle. We pray (among other things) chadeish yameinu: renew our days; chadeish aleinu Shana Tova: renew a good year for us. So I ask you, in the weeks leading up to Rosh Hashana set aside some time to consider what that renewal might look like for you. Temple Shir Shalom is firmly in its "teen years" now. If you have been part of the congregation for some time, think about the energy and excitement of the early days. What parts of that can we

As we look ahead, there is much going on as we drift into Fall, and more importantly, our High Holiday Season. While some things will be quite similar, such as our beautiful space at FUMCO, other small tweaks will hopefully show continued effort by our Board team to add value and sincerity to your experience with Temple Shir Shalom. I want to thank Aaron Sherman and our ritual committee and all the volunteers in advance, for the efforts they'll put forth to help make certain our journey through the High Holidays is rich and meaningful. All of you who will help to lead services, sing in our choir, sit on the Bima, or simply just attend and enjoy, I want to thank you for inspiring our Temple Shir Shalom family to have the most rewarding of New Years.

MAGAL is rolling


